How to have The "Talk"	
The talk isn't something to be nervous about. And	
just remember, if you don't have the talk with your	
kid, someone else will. And you may not agree with	
what they have to say. These talking points serve	
as a great starting point.	
1.Be clear about your expectations.	
. Adolescents engaged in sexual activities at	
earlier ages when they perceived parental	
approval of premarital sex. (Jaccard & Dittus, 2000)	
2. Talk early and often, but in age-appropriate	
terms.	
. If your kid is asking questions, it's because they	
 want to know. Don't shut down conversation if	
you don't think they are old enough. Instead, find	
ways to answer their questions in a way they will	
understand. And use medical terms (avoid slang	
terms and euphemisms).	

How to have The "Talk"	
3. Know the risks and consequences yourself.	
. Did you know that according to the CDC, almost	
half of all STD cases occur in 15- to 24-year-	
olds? And according to the Guttmacher Institute,	
3 in 10 teen girls become pregnant before	
turning 20.	
4. Share the future impact.	
Again, according to the CDC, STDs can lead to	
infertility. In addition, nearly 50-percent of	
teen mothers do not go on to finish high school.	
Also, check out the role Sexual Risk Avoidance	
plays in the Success Sequence.	
The talk shouldn't be a single event. It should be a	
continuing conversation. Check in with your kids	
early and often in order to maintain open lines of	
communication. And don't think that because of	
your past choices, you can't talk to your kid. It's	
never a bad thing to want something better for	
your children.
